

Highlights




Population Growth: Population in the A.K. Smiley Library district increased by 8% over the last decade to 69,000, growing slower than the 10% statewide rate. The population increased by 5,000 people, with most of the growth occurring in the Hispanic population.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition shifted over the past decade, with the Hispanic population increasing by 6,000, now representing 30% of the total population, up from 24% in 2000. The white, non-Hispanic population declined by 3,000, from 63% to 54% of total, and the Asian share of population grew slightly from 5% to 7% of total.

Age Structure: The age structure has not changed significantly and is similar to the statewide age structure, with a median age of 36 years old, slightly higher than that of the state. The share of population age 65+ stayed constant at 13% of total, slightly more than the 11% share statewide.

Education: Adults in the A.K. Smiley Library district are relatively more educated than adults statewide, with 36% having attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of adults in California. Only 11% of adults here have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.

Income: Median household income is \$64,000, slightly higher than the statewide median of \$60,000.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




