


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: Population in the City of Alameda increased by 2%, between 2000 and 2010 and now stands at 74,000. The white, non-Hispanic population declined by more than 4,000 (-12%), while the Asian population grew by 4,000 (22%).

Diversity: The population mix in the City of Alameda has shifted significantly over the past decade as the white, non-Hispanic share of the population declined from 52% to 45% of the total. The Asian share increased from 26% to 31% of the total and the Hispanic share increased from 9% to 11%.

Age Structure: The population in the City of Alameda is relatively old, with a median age of 41, compared with 35 statewide. The increase in median age from 38 to 41 stems from an upward shift within the working-age population, even though the overall share of working-age population increased only slightly. The share of population age 65+ increased only slightly from 13% to 14%.

Households: A relatively large percentage of individuals live alone: 31% of households are single-person, compared with 23% in California overall. Further, 28% of Hispanic households consist of a single individual, whereas statewide only 11% of Hispanic households are single-person.


Education: On average, adults in Alameda are significantly more educated than in California as a whole. Overall, only 9% of individuals did not graduate from high school compared with 20% statewide. Further, 45% of adults have at least a Bachelor's degree, whereas in California this figure stands at 30%.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




