

Highlights




**Population Growth:** The total population in Amador County increased by 9% over the past decade to 38,000. Large increases occurred in the Hispanic population (1,600) and the white, non-Hispanic population (1,400). The number of young people declined (-900).

**Diversity:** Amador County remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic at 80%, with the Hispanic share increasing from 9% to 12% over the past ten years.

**Age structure:** Amador County is older than California overall, and over the past decade, the age structure shifted upward due to an increase in the number of people age 65+ and a loss of young people. The median age increased from 43 to 48, compared with 35 for California overall. The share of population made up of people age 65+ is 21% of the total, compared with 11% statewide.

**Households:** Families without children are more common in Amador than statewide—making up 46% of households here compared with 36% statewide. Husband-wife families with children declined from 18% to 14% of total households, compared with 23% in California overall. Older people are more likely to be living with a spouse in Amador County—30% of people age 65+ here, compared with 21% statewide.

**Education:** High school attainment is higher but college attainment is lower than in the state overall. Amador County has a smaller share of adults who have not completed high school—13% compared with 20% statewide. Conversely, a smaller share of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree—20% compared with 30% in California overall.








2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09







13. Labor Force and Unemployment, 2006-11






14. Household Type, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09
