

Highlights



Population Growth: The population of Beaumont more than tripled over the last decade from 11,000 to 37,000. Population gains were broad based with large gains occurring in the Hispanic population (11,000) and in the white, non-Hispanic population (9,000).


Diversity: The population mix shifted dramatically over the past ten years with the white, non-Hispanic share falling from its majority 56% to 43% and the Hispanic share increasing from 36% to 40%. The Asian and black populations in Beaumont grew substantially and their shares of total population increased to 7% and 6% respectively.

Age Structure: Beaumont remains relatively young with a median age of 32, compared with 35 statewide. The age 65+ share of total matches the statewide 11%, but Beaumont has a larger share of young people, 33% compared with 28% statewide.

Households: Family households, at 79% of total, are much more common in Beaumont than statewide (69%). Traditional families are also more common here: husband-wife families with children account for 30% of all households compared with 23% statewide.

Education: High school attainment is higher but college attainment is lower than in the state overall. Beaumont has a smaller share of adults who have not completed high school—16% compared with 20% statewide, but only 23% of adults have earned Bachelor’s degrees, compared with 30% statewide.

Note: The Beaumont Library District extends beyond the city limits of Beaumont. This profile covers only the population within the city limits.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




