

Highlights



**Population Growth:** Burbank’s population increased by 3% in the last ten years to 103,000. The population gain was concentrated in the working-age population, while a large decline occurred in the population of young people. Asians accounted for 90% of the net population gain.

**Diversity:** Burbank remains majority white, non-Hispanic, and the racial and ethnic composition remained relatively constant over the past decade. The white, non-Hispanic share of population decreased slightly from 59% to 58%, and the Hispanic share remained at about 25% of total. The Asian share increased from 9% to 11%.


**Age Structure:** Burbank’s population is older than that of the state, with a median age of 39 (up from 36 in 2000), compared with 35 for the state. The age structure shifted slightly upward over the past ten years as the number of young people declined and the share of the population age 65+ edged up to just over 13%.

**Households:** Burbank's share of family households, at 61% of total, is below the statewide share of 69%, and the share of households with children is only 27%, compared with 33% for California as a whole. Individuals living alone account for 31% of all households, significantly higher than the statewide share of 23%. Among those age 65+, 30% live alone.

**Education:** Educational attainment in Burbank is somewhat higher than for California overall. Thirty-four percent of adults have attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of adults statewide. Only 17% of adults in Burbank have less than a high school education, compared with 20% of adults in California.

**Income:** Households in Burbank have incomes similar to California generally. Median household income is \$62,000, just 3% higher than the state median.

**Foreign Born:** The foreign-born population accounts for 32% of the total population, compared with 27% statewide. Just over half of the immigrants are from Asia, with 18% from Mexico and 16% from other Latin American countries.



Population by Age






2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09



a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




