


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: Population in the Burlingame Library jurisdiction increased by only 2% over the past ten years, to 40,000. This growth rate is significantly slower than the 10% overall growth rate of the state. The only age group with a net increase was young people.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition has shifted over the past decade, with the white, non-Hispanic share of the population decreasing from 71% to 62%, the Asian share increasing from 17% to 22%, and the Hispanic share increasing from 8% to 11% of total.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted downward slightly, with the population of young people increasing by 11%. The share of the population age 65+ stayed constant at 16%, higher than the 11% share statewide.

Households: Twenty-nine percent of all households in this jurisdiction are single-person households, compared with 23% statewide. Among people age 65+, 19% live alone, and 16% live in group homes, a rate much higher than the 4% of older adults living in group homes statewide.

Education: The population is highly educated, with 57% of adults having attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of the state population. Only 5% have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.

Income: Residents in this jurisdiction have relatively high incomes, with 33% reporting household income of \$150,000 or more, compared with 12% statewide. The median income in Hillsborough is over \$200,000, more than triple the statewide median income of \$60,000.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for 24% of the total, similar to the statewide share of 27%. However, the composition by region of origin differs significantly from California: 60% are from Asia and only 16% are from Latin America.



In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change

6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets



7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10






8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




