

Highlights




**Population Growth:** Over the past decade, the population of Calexico grew by 11,000 (42%), to 39,000. Nearly all of the gain occurred in the Hispanic population, which grew by 45%, and the working-age population accounted for most of the increase.

**Diversity:** Calexico is almost entirely Hispanic, with the share of population at 97% of total, up from 95% in 2000.

**Age Structure:** Calexico remains younger than California as a whole. The median age increased from 29 to 32 years old between 2000 and 2010, still lower than the state median of 35 years. While 28% of the statewide population is under age 20, in Calexico this figure stands at 35%.

**Households:** The traditional family—a married couple with children—is much more prevalent in Calexico than in California as a whole. Traditional families account for 32% of all households, compared with 23% statewide. Further, only 12% of households are single-person, compared with 23% statewide.

**Foreign Born:** The foreign-born population accounts for 45% of Calexico’s total population, compared with 27% statewide. Among the foreign born the vast majority, 96%, are from Mexico. Additionally, 36% of households in Calexico are linguistically isolated, nearly four times the statewide figure of 10%.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




