

Highlights




Population Growth: The total population of Camarillo increased by 14% between 2000 and 2010, and now stands at 65,000. The Hispanic population increased by 6,000 (69%), while the white, non-Hispanic population decreased by 1,000 (-3%).

Diversity: Camarillo remains majority white, non-Hispanic, but its racial and ethnic composition has changed since 2000. The white, non-Hispanic share of the population declined from 73% to 62% of the total, while the Hispanic share of the population increased from 16% to 23% of the total.

Age Structure: The population of Camarillo is older than California as a whole; the city’s median age is 41, compared with the statewide median of 35. Further, individuals age 65+ comprise 17% of the city’s total population, compared with 11% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment in Camarillo is relatively high compared with California overall. Thirty-eight percent of adults have at least a Bachelor’s degree compared with 30% statewide. Further, only 9% of adults have not completed high school, whereas statewide this figure stands at 20%.

Income: Household income in Camarillo is relatively high compared with income in California overall; median household income is \$82,000, 36% greater than the statewide median of \$60,000. The city’s unemployment rate is correspondingly low, at 7% in June 2011, compared with California’s rate of 12%.




Population by Age




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Labor Force In thousands Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




