
**Population Growth:** The population of the Coalinga-Huron Unified School District Library jurisdiction increased by 12% over the past decade to 20,000, growing at a rate similar to the statewide growth rate of 10%. The greatest increase was among the Hispanic population, which increased by nearly 2,000 (14%).

**Diversity:** The Coalinga-Huron Unified School District Library jurisdiction remains majority Hispanic, with the share of population increasing slightly from 67% to 68% of total. The white, non-Hispanic share of population decreased from 29% to 26% of total.

**Age Structure:** In general, the jurisdiction is much younger than California as a whole, with young people making up 35% of the population, compared with 28% statewide. Further, only 7% of the population is age 65+ compared with 11% in California overall.

**Households:** Traditional families—married couples with children—are more prominent here than in the state as a whole. Overall, 29% of households consist of traditional families, compared with 23% statewide. In addition, fewer individuals live alone; only 17% of households are single-person compared with 23% statewide.

**Education:** Educational attainment is significantly lower here than in California as a whole. Overall, only 7% of adults have received a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California. Additionally, 45% of adults do not have a high school diploma (for Hispanic adults, this figure is 63%), compared with 20% statewide.



Population by Age






2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




