

Highlights



Population Growth: The population of Corona increased by 22% over the past decade to 152,000, growing more than twice as fast as the state. Most of the gain occurred in the Hispanic population which grew by 49% (22,000).


Diversity: The population mix in Corona has shifted dramatically since 2000. The white, non-Hispanic population, formerly the largest group, decreased from 47% to 38% of total, while the Hispanic population increased from 36% to 44%.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted upward over the past ten years, but Corona is still younger than California overall. Median age increased from 30 to 32, compared with the statewide median of 35, and the share of the population age 65+ increased from 6% to 7%, still much lower than the 11% statewide.

Households: Family households, at 81% of total, are much more common in Corona than statewide (69%). Traditional families—married couples with children—are also more common here, accounting for 35% of all households compared with 23% statewide. The majority of older people, 59%, live with relatives other than a spouse.

Education: High school completion here matches the state's 80% rate, but Bachelor's degree attainment is lower here than in California overall. Only 24% of adults in Corona have earned a Bachelor's degree or higher, compared with 30% in California overall.

Income: Median household income is \$78,000, 29% higher than the California median.




Population by Age




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




