

Highlights




Population Growth: The population of Del Norte County increased by 4% over the past ten years to 29,000, growing significantly slower than the statewide growth rate of 10%. The number of young people declined by roughly 700 (-9%) between 2000 and 2010.

Diversity: Del Norte County remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic, though the share of total has decreased from 70% to 65% over the past ten years. The Hispanic share of population increased from 14% to 18% of total.

Age Structure: Compared with California as a whole, Del Norte County is somewhat older, with a median age of 39, higher than the state median age of 35. The share of population age 65+ is 14%, higher than the statewide rate of 11%.

Education: Educational attainment is lower in Del Norte County than in California as a whole. Only 15% of all adults have attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide. Just over 20% of adults have less than a high school diploma, roughly the same as the rate statewide.

Income: Household income in Del Norte County is relatively low compared with California overall, with median household income of \$38,000, only 64% of the statewide median. Thirty-five percent of households report annual incomes of less than \$25,000, whereas statewide this figure stands at only 20%.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




