




Highlights



Population by Age

**Population Growth:** Over the last decade, Dixon grew by 14% to 18,000 people. This is a higher growth rate than the 10% rate statewide. The majority of this growth occurred within the Hispanic population.

**Diversity:** The population mix in Dixon shifted, with the Hispanic population increasing from 34% to 40% of the total and the white, non-Hispanic population declining from 58% to 49%.

**Age Structure:** Dixon has a median age of 33, younger than the statewide median of 35. Only 8% of the population is age 65+, compared with 11% of the population statewide.

**Households:** Thirty-one percent of households are traditional families—married couples with children—compared with 23% statewide, though this share is down from 40% in 2000. Only 15% of households are individuals living alone, compared with 23% statewide. The majority of people age 65+, 58%, live with relatives other than a spouse.

**Education:** Educational attainment in Dixon is below the statewide level. Although high school completion rates are comparable with California as a whole at 79%, a smaller share of adults in Dixon has a Bachelor’s degree (19%) than statewide (30%).

**Income:** Median household income is \$70,000, 15% above the statewide median of \$60,000. Only 13% of households in Dixon have incomes of less than \$25,000, compared with 20% in California overall.

**Foreign Born:** A smaller share of the population is foreign born, 22%, than in the state as a whole, 27%; however, a larger share of households are linguistically isolated, 13%, compared with 10% statewide. Seventy-eight percent of the foreign-born population is from Mexico, compared with 44% in California as a whole.



In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




