





Highlights




Population Growth: The population of El Dorado County increased by 16% over the past decade to 181,000, growing faster than the statewide rate of 10%. The population 65+ increased by over 7,000 (37%).

Diversity: In the past ten years, the white, non-Hispanic share of population decreased from 85% to 80% of total, while the Hispanic share of population increased from 9% to 12%.

Age Structure: El Dorado County is relatively old compared with California as a whole, with a median age of 44 compared with 35 statewide. Further, 15% of the population is age 65+ compared with 11% statewide.

Education: High school attainment is higher in El Dorado County than in California overall. Only 8% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide. Just over 31% of adults have attained a Bachelor's degree or higher, roughly the same as in the state as a whole.

Income: Households in El Dorado County have somewhat higher incomes compared with California as a whole, with median household income of \$71,000, 17% higher than the statewide median of \$60,000.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




