


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The total population in Escondido increased by 8% over the past decade to 144,000, a growth rate slightly lower than the statewide growth rate of 10%. The greatest growth occurred among Hispanics (19,000). Despite the overall growth, the white, non-Hispanic population declined (-11,000).

Diversity: The population mix has shifted over the past ten years, with the Hispanic share increasing from 39% to 49%, while the white, non-Hispanic share declined from 52% to 40% of total. Race and ethnicity vary substantially by age—young people are majority Hispanic at 66%, while people age 65+ are predominantly white, non-Hispanic at 75%.

Age Structure: The population is younger than California overall, and the age structure shifted slightly toward the working ages over the past decade. The working-age group grew by 9,000 and increased from 56% to 59% of the total population. Median age is 32, compared with the statewide median of 35.

Households: Older people are more likely to be living alone here. Thirty percent of people age 65+ are living alone compared with 25% statewide, the majority of which are women.

Education: Educational attainment for Escondido is lower than for California overall. Just 21% of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide, and 24% have not completed high school, compared with 20% in California overall. More than half of Hispanic adults in Escondido have not completed high school.


Foreign Born: Escondido has a large foreign-born population making up 29% of the total. The majority of these individuals are from Mexico, 73%, though Asia is a common region of origin as well, 15%. Additionally, 13% of households are linguistically isolated, meaning that no one in these households age 14 and over speaks English at least “very well.”

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




