

Highlights



Population Growth: Population in Folsom has grown significantly in the past decade; the total population increased by 39% to 72,000. This compares to a 10% growth rate statewide. The largest increase was among the working-age population, which increased by 13,000.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Folsom has shifted since 2000. The white, non-Hispanic share of the population decreased from 74% to 66% of the total. At the same time, the Asian share increased from 7% to 12% and the Hispanic share increased from 10% to 11%.


Age Structure: Compared with California overall, Folsom is somewhat older. The median age is 38, compared with a median age in California of 35.

Households: Thirty percent of households are traditional families—married couples with children—compared with 23% statewide. Among people age 65+, 30% live alone, compared with 25% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment is higher in Folsom than in California overall. Only 11% did not complete high school as compared to 20% statewide, and 40% have attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher compared with 30% statewide.

Income: The median household income in Folsom is \$92,000, which is 53% higher than California’s statewide median household income.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for only 13% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. The majority of this population (57%) is from Asia.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




4. Population Total, 1990-2010

5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




