

Highlights




Population Growth: The population in Glendora grew by less than 1,000 over the past decade, increasing to 50,000. The Hispanic population grew by 4,600, while the white, non-Hispanic population fell by 5,000.

Diversity: The white, non-Hispanic population, still the largest group, decreased from 68% to 57% of total, while the Hispanic population increased from 22% to 31% of total.

Age Structure: The population of Glendora is relatively old, with a median age of 40, compared with 35 for the state. The age structure shifted upward over the past ten years due to a decline in the number of young people and an increase in the number of working-age people. The population age 65+ increased slightly from 13% to 14% of total, higher than the 11% share in California as a whole. The growing Hispanic population is relatively young, with a median age of just 30.

Households: Family households, at 76% of total, are much more common in Glendora than statewide (69%). The majority of these are families without children. Married couples with children account for 25% of all households, compared with 23% statewide. Among people age 65+, 22% live alone, and 12% live in group homes, a rate much higher than the 4% of older adults living in group homes statewide.

Income: Incomes are relatively high across racial and ethnic groups, with median household income of \$75,000, 25% higher than the California median. The unemployment rate, 7% in June 2011, has consistently been below the California rate.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




