


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The population of Carmel, now 3,700, decreased by nearly 9% over the last decade, in contrast with statewide growth of 10%. A decrease in the white, non-Hispanic working-age population accounted for almost the entire decline.

Diversity: Carmel remains predominately white, non-Hispanic, and this population share decreased only slightly over the last decade, from 93% to 90%.

Age Structure: The population in Carmel is much older than the rest of the state, with a median age of 59. Thirty-six percent of residents are age 65+, much higher than 11% statewide. Only 11% of the population is 20 or younger, compared with 28% statewide.

Households: Only 7% of Carmel households are traditional families—married couples with children—compared with 23% statewide. Forty-five percent of households are individuals living alone, compared with 23% statewide. Of those age 65+, 34% live alone, compared with 25% of Californians in the same age bracket.

Education: Carmel has very high levels of educational attainment, with nearly 65% of adults having completed a Bachelor’s degree, more than twice the rate in California as a whole. Less than 1% of adults have not completed high school.

Income: Median household income is relatively high, at \$78,000, compared with \$60,000 statewide. Median income for the small Hispanic population is significantly lower than for the other racial and ethnic groups.


Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for only 6% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. The composition by region of origin differs significantly from California as a whole, with the majority from Asia (51%).

Males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change


6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets

Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10

a) By Age b) By Race and Ethnicity




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




