

Highlights




**Population Growth:** The total population in Huntington Beach remained constant at 190,000 over the past decade, while California grew by 10%. The number of working-age and young people decreased, while the number of older adults increased.

**Diversity:** The population mix has shifted slightly over the last ten years, with the Hispanic share of population increasing from 15% to 17%, the Asian share increasing from 9% to 11%, and the white, non-Hispanic share decreasing from 72% to 67% of total.

**Age Structure:** This jurisdiction is older than California overall, and the age structure shifted upward considerably over the past decade. Median age increased from 36 to 40, compared with 35 statewide. People age 65+ make up 14% of the total population, up from 10% in 2000 and compared with 11% statewide.

**Education:** Educational attainment is higher here than in the state overall. Just 7% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide, and 40% have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California overall.

**Income:** Incomes are relatively high in this area. Median household income is \$80,000, which is 32% higher than the California median. Forty percent of households have incomes of \$100,000 or higher, compared with 27% statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Labor Force In thousands Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




