

Highlights



**Population Growth:** Population in Irwindale declined by 2% over the past ten years to 1,400.

**Diversity:** Irwindale remains predominantly Hispanic, with the Hispanic share of total population increasing from 88% in 2000 to 91% in 2010. The white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 9% to 6%.


**Age Structure:** Although Irwindale remains slightly younger than the state, the age structure shifted upward over the past decade due to a decrease in the number of young people and an increase in people age 65+. The median age increased from 28 to 34 and the share of 65+ increased from 8% to 11%, just matching the statewide share.

**Households:** Family households, at 83% of total, are much more common in Irwindale than statewide (69%) and more of these family households have children than is the case statewide; family households with children are 40% of total, compared with 33% statewide.

**Education:** Educational attainment is much lower in this jurisdiction than in California overall. Just 7% of adults have earned Bachelor’s degrees, compared with 30% of adults statewide, and 38% have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.

**Income:** Median household income is \$63,000, 5% higher than the California median.

**Foreign Born:** Irwindale has a large foreign-born population making up 26% of the total, similar to the share statewide. Almost all of the immigrants are from Latin America and 94% are from Mexico.





Males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change


6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets

Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10

a) By Age      b) By Race and Ethnicity




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




