

Highlights



Population Growth: The total population in Lake County increased by 11% over the past decade to 65,000, mirroring the 10% overall growth in California. The greatest growth occurred in the Hispanic population, which increased by 4,000 people (67%).


Diversity: Lake County is predominantly white, non-Hispanic, though this share declined over the past decade from 80% to 74%, while the Hispanic share increased from 11% to 17% of total.

Age Structure: Lake County is older than California overall with a median age of 45, up from 43 in 2000, compared with 35 statewide. The age structure shifted toward the working ages over the past ten years with 20% growth in this group, while the number of young people and older people remained constant.

Households: Nonfamily households, including householders living alone or two or more unrelated individuals, are common here—making up 39% of households compared with 31% statewide. Husband-wife families with children are less common—making up 14% of households compared with 23% statewide.

Income: Incomes are relatively low here with median household income of \$41,000, just 68% of the California median. The unemployment rate, 17% in June 2011, is higher than the statewide rate of 12%, and the size of the labor force has increased since 2008 while declining in California overall.

Education: High school attainment is higher but college attainment is lower than in the state overall. Fourteen percent of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide, and 16% have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California.








2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




