

Highlights



Population Growth: The population of Larkspur decreased very slightly to just below 12,000, while California grew by 10% over the past decade. The steepest decline was in the working-age white, non-Hispanic population.

Diversity: Larkspur remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic, although the population share for this group declined slightly over the past ten years, from 88% to 82% of the total. The Hispanic share of the population, while small, has doubled from 4% to 8% of the total.


Age Structure: Larkspur is much older than California overall, with a median age of 48, compared with the statewide median of 35. The share of population age 65+ is 21% of the total, compared with 11% statewide.

Households: Single-person households are common here—43% percent of all households are single-person, which is nearly double the 23% share in the state as a whole.

Education: The population is highly educated, with 60% of adults having attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared to 30% in the state overall. Only 3% have not completed high school, compared with nearly 20% statewide.

Income: Median income is \$84,000, which is 40% higher than that of California as a whole.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for 17% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. The majority of the immigrants, 52%, are from Europe.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09



a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Labor Force In thousands Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




