

Highlights



**Population Growth:** The incorporated area of the Lompoc Public Library jurisdiction grew by 5% between 2000 and 2010 to a total population of 47,000. This is lower than the statewide growth rate of 10%, but similar to the rate for Santa Barbara County (6%). Most of the population gain occurred in the Hispanic population (7,000), while the white, non-Hispanic population declined (-4,000).


**Diversity:** The population mix has shifted over the last decade, with the white, non-Hispanic share decreasing from 50% to 39% of total, and the Hispanic share increasing from 36% to 49%.

**Age Structure:** The age structure in this area shifted slightly over the last ten years. The young share of the population declined by 5%, though there was growth in the number of young Hispanics. In contrast to aging trends statewide, the share of the population age 65+ in the jurisdiction remained constant at 10%.

**Education:** Educational attainment is lower in this jurisdiction than in California as a whole. Just 13% of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of adults statewide, and 26% have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.

**Income:** The median household income is \$75,000 in Buellton, and \$46,000 in Lompoc, compared with \$60,000 statewide. In the combined jurisdiction, 27% of households reported income less than \$25,000, compared with 20% of households in California.

*Note: The Lompoc Public Library jurisdiction includes Buellton and Lompoc as well as some of the surrounding unincorporated area. This profile covers the combined population of Buellton and Lompoc. Profiles for the individual cities are also available.*





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change








7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




