

Highlights




Population Growth: Population in Long Beach stayed roughly constant at 462,000 over the past ten years. The Hispanic population increased by more than 23,000 (14%), while the white, non-Hispanic population declined by 17,000 (-11%). The black population also decreased by 7,000 (-10%).

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Long Beach has shifted over the past ten years with the Hispanic share increasing from 36% to 41% and the white, non-Hispanic share falling from 33% to 29%.

Age Structure: Long Beach is slightly younger than California overall, with a median age of 33, up from 31 in 2000 yet still lower than the state median of 35 years old. The rise in median age is due to a decrease in the number of young people, whose share of population declined from 32% to 28% of total. The share of population age 65+ stayed constant at 9% of total, compared with 11% statewide.

Households: Long Beach has a much smaller share of family households, at 61%, than the statewide rate of 69%, and a much larger share of single-person households (28%) than the state (23%). Among people age 65+, 29% live alone, slightly higher than the statewide rate of 25%.

Education: Educational attainment in Long Beach is slightly lower than California rates: 28% of the adult population holds Bachelor’s degrees or higher compared with a California average of 30%, and 22% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.








2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




