

Highlights



**Population Growth:** Population in Mill Valley increased by 2% over the past decade to almost 14,000, a rate slower than the 10% statewide growth rate. A decline in the working-age white, non-Hispanic population occurred.

**Diversity:** The racial and ethnic mix did not change significantly over the past ten years, and Mill Valley remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic at 86% of total population. The Hispanic and Asian shares of population increased slightly over the last decade.


**Age Structure:** Mill Valley is much older than the state overall with a median age of 47, compared with the state median of 35. Additionally, the share of population age 65+ is 19% of total, compared with 11% statewide.

**Households:** Single-person households are common here, making up 33% of all households compared with 23% statewide. Among individuals 65+, 42% live alone, compared with 25% statewide.

**Education:** The population is highly educated, with 71% of adults having attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared to 30% of the state population. Only 3% of the population has less than a high school degree, compared with 20% statewide.

**Income:** Median household income is \$106,000, 76% higher than that of California as a whole. Thirty-six percent of households report income of \$150,000 or more, compared with 12% of households in California.

**Foreign Born:** The foreign-born population accounts for 13% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. Only 4% of this population is from Mexico, compared with 44% statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




**2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010**






**5. 10-Year Population Change**

6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets



7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10


a) By Age

b) By Race and Ethnicity




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010



10. Foreign Born, 2005-09




11. Household Language, 2005-09





12. Household Income, 2005-09



13. Labor Force and Unemployment, 2006-11





14. Household Type, 2010



15. Average Household Size, 2010




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09
