


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: Population in Modoc County grew by just 3% over the past decade to almost 10,000, compared with the statewide growth rate of 10%. A 16% decrease in the number of young people was balanced by increases in both the working-age population and the population age 65+.

Diversity: Modoc County remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic (79%), although the Hispanic share of the population grew from 12% to 14% of the total over the past decade.

Age Structure: Modoc County is older than the state overall, and the age structure shifted upward over the past ten years. The median age increased from 42 to 46, which is significantly higher than the California median of 35. The share of the population age 65+ is 20%, compared with 11% statewide.

Households: Traditional families—married couples with children—are much less common in Modoc County than statewide; they account for 15% of households compared with 23% in California as a whole. Twenty-nine percent of households are single-person, compared with 23% statewide.

Income: The median household income of \$34,000 is only 56% of the state median income. Thirty-seven percent of Modoc County residents have household income of less than \$25,000, compared with 20% of Californians.


Foreign Born: A much smaller share of the population is foreign born, 6%, than in the state as a whole, 27%. Seventy percent of this population is from Mexico, compared with 44% statewide.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010

Males on left, females on right




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




