



Highlights



**Population Growth:** Population in Orland increased by 16% between 2000 and 2010 to 7,300, growing faster than the statewide rate of 10%. The greatest growth occurred among Hispanics (900).


**Diversity:** Over the past decade, the white, non-Hispanic share of population declined from 57% to 49%, while the Hispanic share increased from 37% to 45% of total.

**Age Structure:** The age structure shifted slightly upward, with the number of working-age adults increasing by 24%. The median age increased from 31 to 32, still below the state median of 35 years old.

**Education:** Educational attainment is lower in this jurisdiction than in California overall. Just 11% of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide, and 31% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.

**Income:** Incomes are relatively low in Orland, with median household income of \$37,000, only 61% of the California median. Almost 70% of households have yearly income below \$50,000, compared with 42% statewide.



Males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010



10. Foreign Born, 2005-09




11. Household Language, 2005-09





12. Household Income, 2005-09



**b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\***




13. Labor Force and Unemployment, 2006-11





14. Household Type, 2010



15. Average Household Size, 2010




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09
