

Highlights




Population Growth: The population of Oxnard grew by 16% in the past decade and currently stands at 198,000; this growth was substantially higher than the statewide rate of 10%. The increase was concentrated among the Hispanic population, which grew by nearly 33,000 (29%).

Diversity: Over the past decade, the Hispanic share of the population increased from 66% to 74% of the total, while white, non-Hispanics declined as a share of the population, from 21% to 15% of the total.

Age Structure: The population of Oxnard is relatively young, with a median age of 30, compared with the statewide median of 35. Individuals under age 20 comprise 33% of the city’s population compared with 28% in the state. Further, the young population increased by 10% between 2000 and 2010, a rate greater than the statewide growth rate of 2% for this age group.

Households: The traditional family—a married couple with children—is more common in Oxnard than in the state as a whole. Overall, 31% of the city’s households consist of traditional families, compared with 23% statewide. In addition, fewer individuals live alone: only 14% of households are single-person compared with 23% in California.

Foreign Born: Thirty-seven percent of Oxnard’s population is foreign born, a share well above the statewide figure of 27%. Among the foreign born, 79% are from Mexico, whereas statewide 44% of immigrants are from Mexico. Eighteen percent of all households are linguistically isolated, compared with 10% of households in California.








2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




