

Highlights



Population Growth: Population in Pasadena increased by 2% over the past decade to 137,000, growing at a rate similar to that of Los Angeles County but slower than the statewide rate of 10%. Despite the overall increase in population, the black population declined (-5,000), as did the number of young people (-4,000). The greatest growth was in the Asian population (6,000).


Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Pasadena has shifted somewhat over the last decade, with the Asian share of population increasing from 10% to 14%, and the black share of population decreasing from 14% to 10% of total. The largest groups are still white, non Hispanics (39%) and Hispanics (34%).

Age Structure: Pasadena is somewhat older than the state overall, and the age structure shifted upward slightly over the past ten years. The median age increased from 34 to 37, higher than the state median of 35 years old, due to a decrease in the number of young people and an increase in the older population. The share of the population age 65+ increased from 12% to 14% of the total, higher than the 11% share statewide.

Households: Older people in Pasadena are more likely to be living in a group home than older people statewide—13% of people age 65+ compared with 4%. They are also more likely to be living alone—30% compared with 25%.

Education: Educational attainment is higher here than in the state overall. Just under 46% of adults have attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California as a whole. Sixteen percent of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide.

Foreign Born: Pasadena has a large foreign-born population, making up 28% of the total—40,000 people. Foreign-born individuals are most commonly from Asia (37%), Mexico (33%), and other parts of Latin America (16%).








2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




