

Highlights



**Population Growth:** Population in San Anselmo stayed largely the same over the past ten years at 12,000, in contrast to statewide growth of 10%. The largest decline was in the working-age white, non-Hispanic population.

**Diversity:** The racial and ethnic mix did not change greatly from 2000 to 2010, and San Anselmo remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic at 86%. The Hispanic share of population increased from 4% to 6% of total.


**Age Structure:** San Anselmo is older than the state overall with a median age of 45, compared with 35 for California. The share of people age 65+ is 14% of total, higher than the 11% share statewide.

**Households:** Single-person households are common here—30% percent of all households consist of individuals living alone, compared with 23% statewide.

**Education:** The population is highly educated, with 60% of adults having attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide. Only 3% of the population has less than a high school degree, compared with 20% statewide.

**Income:** Median household income is \$91,000, 50% higher than the California median. Only 12% of households report incomes below \$25,000, compared with 20% statewide.

**Foreign Born:** The foreign-born population accounts for only 10% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. The majority of this population (52%) is from Europe.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




