


Highlights



Population by Age

Population Growth: The San Bernardino County Library jurisdiction grew by 19% between 2000 and 2010 to a total population of 1.2 million. This area grew more than California (10%) and at a similar rate as San Bernardino County overall. Like the state, the greatest growth occurred in the Hispanic population (196,000 people) and the Asian population (29,000 people). Despite the overall growth, the white, non-Hispanic population declined by 41,000 people (-9%).

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of this jurisdiction has shifted over the past decade. The Hispanic share of the population increased from 37% to 48%, while the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 47% to 36% of total. The Asian share also grew slightly from 5% to 6% of total.

Age Structure: This area is younger than California. Like in San Bernardino County overall, the portion of the population age 65+ remained unchanged over the past ten years at 9%, slightly below the statewide share of 11%. The age structure shifted upward slightly toward the working ages from the younger ages.

Households: Traditional families—married couples with children—are more common in this area than in California as a whole with 28% of all households, compared with 23% statewide. The majority of people age 65+ live with relatives other than a spouse.

Education: Educational attainment is lower in this jurisdiction than in California overall. Just 17% of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of adults statewide, and 23% have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide.


Note: The San Bernardino County Library jurisdiction includes the county population that is not served by the seven municipal libraries.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




