


Highlights



Population Growth: The population of San Leandro increased by about 5,000 (7%) over the last ten years and currently stands at 85,000. The population of white, non-Hispanics declined by 11,000 (-32%) while the Asian and Hispanic populations each increased by about 7,000. The population age 65+ declined by 1,000 (-8%), moving in the opposite direction of the statewide trend, where the population of this age group increased by 18%.



Population by Age

Diversity: The population mix has shifted significantly over the past decade with the white, non-Hispanic population declining from 42% to 27% of total. The Asian share of total increased from 23% to 29%, while the Hispanic share increased from 20% to 27%.

Age Structure: The population of San Leandro is older than California as a whole, with a median age of 39 compared with 35 statewide. Compared with the state, San Leandro has more older people and fewer young people: 14% of the population is age 65+, compared with 11% statewide, and only 25% of the population is under age 20 compared with 28% statewide. The decline in the share 65+ from 16% in 2000 to 14% in 2010 stems largely from the decline in the white, non-Hispanic population.

Education: The educational attainment level is lower than the statewide level, with only 26% of adults attaining a Bachelor's degree or higher, compared with 30% statewide. Nonetheless, the rate of high school completion was higher here, 83%, than the statewide average of 80%.


Foreign Born: One-third of San Leandro's population is foreign born, compared with 27% statewide, and 13% of all households are linguistically isolated, meaning that no one in the household age 14 and over speaks English at least "very well."

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09








13. Labor Force and Unemployment, 2006-11






14. Household Type, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*





16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09
