

Highlights



**Population Growth:** Over the past ten years, San Mateo grew by 5%, to 97,000, half the statewide growth rate of 10%. The Hispanic population increased by 7,000 people, while the white, non-Hispanic population declined by the same number. The Asian population also increased by 4,000.


**Diversity:** The population mix in San Mateo has shifted over the past decade, with the white, non-Hispanic share of the population decreasing from 57% to 47% of total, the Hispanic share increasing from 21% to 27%, and the Asian share increasing from 15% to 19%.

**Age Structure:** The age structure shifted slightly upward, with median age increasing from 38 to 39, above the statewide median of 35 years old. The share of the population age 65+ is 14% of total, compared with 11% in California overall.

**Education:** Educational attainment in San Mateo is higher than in California overall. Just 11% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide, and 43% have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of adults in California.

**Income:** Median income in San Mateo is relatively high at \$82,000, 35% above the statewide median income of \$60,000.

**Foreign Born:** San Mateo has a large foreign-born population accounting for 34% of the total, compared with 27% statewide. Of this population, 43% are from Asia.



Population by Age



In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




