

Highlights



Population Growth: Population in San Rafael increased by 3% over the past ten years to 58,000, a slower growth rate than the statewide rate of 10%. The greatest increase occurred in the Hispanic population (4,000), while the white, non-Hispanic population declined (-3,000).

Diversity: San Rafael remains majority white, non-Hispanic, although this group’s share of the population declined from 66% to 59% of total over the past decade. The Hispanic share of the population increased from 23% to 30%.


Age Structure: San Rafael is older than California overall with a median age of 40, compared with 35 for the state. The share of the population age 65+ is 16% of the total, compared with 11% statewide.

Households: Single-person households are common here—33% percent of all households consist of individuals living alone, compared with 23% statewide.

Education: The population is highly educated, with 47% of adults having attained a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% of the state population. Fifteen percent of the population has less than a high school degree, compared with 20% statewide.

Income: Median household income in San Rafael is \$71,000, 18% higher than the statewide median income.

Foreign Born: The foreign-born population accounts for 27% of the total, which is the same as statewide. In San Rafael, 31% of foreign-born individuals are from parts of Latin America, excluding Mexico, compared with just 11% statewide.






1. Population by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010

2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010





4. Population Total, 1990-2010




5. 10-Year Population Change








7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




