

Highlights




Population Growth: The population of Signal Hill increased by 18% over the past decade, faster than the statewide pace (10%). The greatest growth occurred in the working-age population, and in the Hispanic and Asian populations.

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Signal Hill shifted significantly over the past decade, with the white, non-Hispanic share of the population decreasing from 36% to 30%, the Hispanic share growing from 29% to 32%, and the Asian share growing from 16% to 20%.

Age Structure: Median age in Signal Hill, 36, is close to the state median of 35, but varies dramatically across racial and ethnic groups, with a median age of 48 for white non-Hispanics, compared with just 27 for Hispanics. The population age 65+ makes up 8% of the total, compared with 11% statewide.

Households: Single-person households are more common in Signal Hill than statewide, accounting for 27% of households, compared with 23% in California overall. Also, older people are more likely to be living alone—30% of people age 65+ live alone, compared with 25% statewide.

Education: Educational attainment levels in Signal Hill were comparable to state levels in 2000, but are now significantly higher. Just 8% of adults have not completed high school, down from 21% in 2000 and compared with 20% of adults statewide. Also, 40% have a Bachelor’s degree, up from 25% in 2000 and compared with 30% in California overall.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change


6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets

Males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10

a) By Age b) By Race and Ethnicity




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




