


Highlights



Population by Age

**Population Growth:** The total population of Siskiyou County has changed little over the last decade; the current population is 45,000. A significant decrease in the number of young people was balanced by an increase in the number of working-age adults and adults age 65+.

**Diversity:** The racial and ethnic composition has shifted somewhat since 2000, although the jurisdiction remains predominantly white, non-Hispanic. The Hispanic share of the population increased from 8% to 10%, and the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 83% to 80% of total.

**Age Structure:** The jurisdiction has a relatively high median age of 47 years old, up from 43 in 2000, and compared with 35 for the state. Twenty percent of the population is age 65+, significantly higher than the 11% of the statewide population.

**Households:** Compared with households in California as a whole, households in the jurisdiction are more likely to be individuals (31% compared with 23% statewide), and less likely to be a traditional family—a married couple with children—14% compared with 23% statewide.

**Education:** The educational attainment picture is mixed. The share of adults with Bachelor’s degrees, 22%, is lower than the California share of 30%. However, the share of adults who did not complete high school is only 12%, compared with 20% in California overall.


**Income:** Median household income is \$38,000, just 63% of the state median. Almost 34% of households have income of less than \$25,000, compared with 20% statewide.

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Labor Force In thousands Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




