

Highlights



Population Growth: Population in this jurisdiction increased by 5% over the last decade, to 368,000. This is half the growth rate of the state as a whole. There was an 8% decrease in people age 0-19, which was more than balanced by a 25% increase in the population age 65+.


Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition has shifted since 2000, with the white, non-Hispanic population share declining from 47% to 39% and the Hispanic population share increasing from 18% to 24%.

Age Structure: The age structure shifted upwards over the past ten years, with an overall decrease in the share of young people and an increase in the shares of working-age people and people age 65+. Age structure varies by race and ethnicity. The Hispanic population is relatively young, with 39% young people and 5% age 65+, while the white, non-Hispanic population is significantly older, with only 19% young people and 17% age 65+.

Education: The educational attainment picture is mixed; 23% of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree, compared with 30% of adults statewide. However, the percentage of adults who did not complete high school is only 15%, compared with 20% in California overall.

Foreign Born: Foreign-born individuals represent 20% of the total population, lower than the statewide share of 27%, but the share of immigrants from Asia is much higher, at 49% compared with 34% statewide.

Note: The Solano County Library jurisdiction includes the county population that is not located within the Benicia Public Library or the Dixon Public Library District. This profile covers the county population not located within the city limits of Benicia or Dixon.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change


6. Population by 5-Year Age Brackets

In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10

a) By Age b) By Race and Ethnicity




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




