


Highlights



Population by Age

**Population Growth:** Total population in the Stockton-San Joaquin County Public Library jurisdiction grew by 23% over the last decade to over 600,000. This rate of population increase is more double the state’s 10% growth rate. The Hispanic population grew by more than 87,000 (56%), and the Asian population increased by 31,000 (52%). In contrast, the white, non-Hispanic population fell by 18,000 (-8%).

**Diversity:** The racial and ethnic composition of the jurisdiction shifted significantly over the past ten years with the Hispanic share increasing from 31% to 39% and the white, non-Hispanic share falling from 46% to 34%.

**Age Structure:** This area is relatively young: 33% of the total population is under 20, compared with 28% percent statewide. Among Hispanics, 42% are under age 20. Ten percent of the population is 65+, compared with 11% statewide.

**Households:** Family households, at 76% of total, are much more common in this area than statewide (69%). The share of traditional households—married couples with children—is 27%, somewhat higher than the statewide average of 23%, while the share of single-person households (19%) is lower than the statewide average of 23%.

**Education:** Adults in the area are relatively less educated than adults statewide, with only 17% of adults having Bachelor’s degrees or higher, compared with 30% in California as a whole. The share of adults who did not complete high school is 24%, slightly higher than the 20% rate in California.

**Income:** More than 45% of households here report income less than \$50,000, compared with 42% statewide, and just 8% report household income of \$150,000 or over, compared with 12% statewide.



In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




