

Highlights



Population Growth: Over the last decade the population of Tulare, now 59,000, increased by 35%—more than three times as fast as the state. An increase of 14,000 people in the Hispanic population accounts for almost all of the growth.


Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Tulare has shifted significantly over the last ten years, with Hispanics now making up 58% of the population, up from 46% in 2000. White, non-Hispanics make up 35% of the total, down from 44% in 2000.

Age Structure: Tulare is young by California standards, with a median age of 29, compared with the statewide median of 35. The age structure has stayed largely the same since 2000, with the share of people age 65+ constant at 9%, below the statewide share of 11%.

Education: Educational attainment is relatively low in Tulare, with only 10% of adults having a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California as a whole. More than 28% of adults in Tulare have not completed high school, compared with 20% of adults statewide.

Income: Households in Tulare have lower incomes than those in California as a whole, with 25% of households reporting income of less than \$25,000, compared with 20% statewide. Median household income is just \$44,000, 73% of the state median.

Foreign Born: In Tulare, 20% of residents are foreign born, compared with 27% of residents statewide. Seventy-three percent are from Mexico, compared with 44% statewide.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




