

Highlights



**Population Growth:** The population of Upland increased by 8% to 74,000 over the past decade, growing slightly slower than the 10% rate statewide.


**Diversity:** The racial and ethnic composition of Upland has shifted significantly since 2000, with no single group making up a majority any longer. The Hispanic share of population increased from 28% to 38%, the white, non-Hispanic share decreased from 55% to 44%, and the Asian share increased slightly from 7% to 8% of total.

**Age Structure:** The age structure in Upland has not changed significantly and is very similar to the statewide age structure. Median age is 36 years old, compared with the state median of 35. The share of population age 65+ is 12%, almost the same as the statewide share.

**Education:** High school attainment in Upland is relatively high. Only 12% of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide. Twenty-nine percent of adults have earned a Bachelor’s degree or higher, compared with 30% in California.

**Income:** Median household income is \$67,000, 10% higher than the state median of \$60,000.

**Foreign Born:** Only 18% of the population in Upland is foreign born, compared with 27% in California. Of those foreign born, 36% are from Asia, 34% are from Mexico, and 17% are from another Latin American Country. Only 5% of households are linguistically isolated, half the 10% share statewide.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity\*

Unemployment Rate




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,\* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity\*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




