

Highlights



**Population Growth:** The total population of the Ventura County Library jurisdiction increased by 6% over the past decade, slower than the statewide growth rate of 10%, and now stands at 370,000. Overall, the Hispanic population increased by 30,000 (35%), while the white, non-Hispanic population decreased by 16,000 (-7%).


**Diversity:** The Ventura County Library jurisdiction remains majority white, non-Hispanic, yet its racial and ethnic composition has changed markedly since 2000. The white, non-Hispanic population declined from 67% to 59% of the total, while the Hispanic population increased from 25% to 31% of the total.

**Age Structure:** The age structure of the jurisdiction closely resembles that of California as a whole. Over the past decade, the population age 65+ increased from 10% to 12%, compared with 11% statewide.

**Education:** Educational attainment is somewhat higher here than in California as a whole, especially in terms of high school completion. Among adults, only 13% have less than a high school education, compared with 20% statewide.

**Income:** Median household income in the Ventura County Library jurisdiction is higher than in California as a whole. Fourteen percent of households report an annual income of less than \$25,000, compared with 20% statewide. Further, 35% of households report an annual income of at least \$100,000, whereas in California this figure stands at 27%.

*Note: The Ventura County Library jurisdiction includes the county population that is not served by the county's four municipal libraries or one special district library.*








2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010



10. Foreign Born, 2005-09











11. Household Language, 2005-09
