

Highlights




Population Growth: The population of Victorville grew by 81% over the past decade to 116,000, growing much faster than the 10% statewide rate. The greatest increases were in the black population (11,000) and the Hispanic population (34,000). Declines occurred among white, non-Hispanic young people (-10%) and the white, non-Hispanic population age 65+ (-3%).

Diversity: The racial and ethnic composition of Victorville has shifted dramatically over the past decade. The Hispanic share of the population increased from 34% to 48%, and the black share also grew from 12% to 16% of total. While the white non-Hispanic population increased in number, its portion of the population was reduced substantially from 48% to 28% of total.

Age Structure: Victorville is younger than the state as a whole, and in contrast to the statewide aging trend, the age structure shifted slightly toward the younger ages over the last decade. The median age decreased from 31 to 30, and the portion of the population age 65+ declined from 11% to 8% of total.

Households: Victorville has a large share of single-parent households—17% of total households here compared with 10% statewide. Living alone is less common in this area—16% of households are single person, down from 19% in 2000, and compared with 23% in California overall. The majority of people age 65+ live with relatives other than a spouse.





In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




