

Highlights




Population Growth: The population of Yuba County increased by 20% over the past decade to 72,000; this growth was twice the statewide rate of 10%. The greatest absolute increases occurred among the Hispanic and white, non-Hispanic populations, which grew by 8,000 and 3,000 respectively.

Diversity: Yuba County remains majority white, non-Hispanic, yet its racial and ethnic composition has changed considerably in the past decade. The white, non-Hispanic population declined as a share of the total, from 65% in 2000 to 59% in 2010. Conversely, the Hispanic share of the population increased from 17% to 25% of the total.

Age Structure: The population of Yuba County is relatively young, with a median age of 32 compared with the statewide median of 35. In addition, 32% of the population is under age 20, while in California this figure stands at 28%.

Income: Household income in Yuba County is relatively low compared with income across the state; median household income is \$46,000—77% of the statewide median of \$60,000. Unemployment is correspondingly high: as of June 2011, the county’s unemployment rate was 18%, compared with 12% statewide.

Poverty: Seventeen percent of individuals in the county live in poverty, compared with 13% across California. The share of people under age 18 living in poverty is particularly high, at 24% compared with 18% statewide.




Population by Age

In thousands; males on left, females on right




2. Race and Ethnicity by Library-Defined Age Group, 2010




3. Population Growth by Library-Defined Age Group, 2000-10




5. 10-Year Population Change





In thousands; males on left, females on right




7. 10-Year Change in Population, 2000-10




8. Population by Age, Race, and Ethnicity, 2010




9. Age Mix by Race and Ethnicity, 2010

11. Household Language, 2005-09




12. Household Income, 2005-09

a) Income Distribution




b) Median Household Income by Race and Ethnicity*




14. Household Type, 2010

a) Total, 2000-10




b) By Race and Ethnicity,* 2010




15. Average Household Size, 2010

By Race and Ethnicity*




16. Living Arrangements Age 65+, 2005-09




