

November 2, 2010 California Library Ballot Measures*

Lincoln City of Lincoln Public Library General Tax	Utility Users Tax Operations	Failed 33% of Yes Vote
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Measure K; Temporary City of Lincoln Essential City Services Protection Measure. To help maintain and protect Lincoln's financial viability and essential services including 9-1-1 emergency/medical response times, helping prevent cuts to police officers, firefighters, library and recreation services, shall the City of Lincoln establish a temporary 3.75% utility users tax ordinance that expires in 4 years, with annual independent audits, public expenditure reports, citizens oversight, low-income senior exemptions, with all revenue dedicated solely for Lincoln and not the State?

Pacific Grove, City of Pacific Grove Public Library Special Tax	Parcel Tax Operations & Facilities	Failed 61.5% Yes Vote
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Measure Q was a \$90 per year parcel tax.

Pomona, City of Pomona Public Library General Tax	Utility User Tax Operations	Failed 26.5% Yes Vote
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Measure SP was a 2% utility user tax increase for 2 years.

San Diego, City of San Diego Public Library General Tax	Sales Tax Operations	Failed 38% of Yes Vote*
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Proposition D read: IF FINANCIAL REFORM CONDITIONS ARE MET, AUTHORIZES TEMPORARY ONE-HALF CENT SALES TAX. To help offset severe state cuts and help restore essential services, including police, fire and street resurfacing, shall the City of San Diego enact a temporary one-half cent sales tax for up to five years, only if the Independent City Auditor certifies conditions have been met, including pension reforms and managed competition?

St. Helena, City of St. Helena Public Library General Tax	Sales Tax Operations & Facilities	Failed 39.9% of Yes Vote
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Measure C was a half cent sales tax for five years.

* *General tax ballot measures and Gann overrides in California require a simple majority (50+%) to pass, but library special tax measures require a 2/3's supermajority to pass.*
